Women's Ministry

During this new quarter of the year, we have had the privilege of presenting the Gospel to many women at Sandy Mush Jail & leading them in a prayer of repentance and surrender of their lives to Jesus Christ. Others have recommitted their lives to Christ. Many are reading their Bibles and growing in their knowledge of the Lord. One unusual encounter took place at the end of a Sunday visit as we walked the hall to the exit. A particularly unkempt young man looked at us through his cell window; broken and bereft. One of the Chaplains felt led to tell the young man that Jesus loved him. The man asked a question, "how would I know that"? Visitation time was over, but the Chaplain explained briefly that Jesus is God, and he came to earth to seek and save the lost, which is all of us. He died a bloody death on a cross, and His blood paid the price for all our sin; we are all sinners. We gave him a Bible, bookmarked to the Gospel of John. He promised to read it. The Chaplain went as a support person to his court hearing in Los Banos recently. He will be released from custody by the middle of March and will be placed in the Rescue Mission Hope for Men, where he will be discipled in his new walk with Christ. God is abundantly faithful!

MERCED COUNTY JAIL MINISTRY

Hello, my name is Monica Sanchez. Let me start by saying I thank Jesus for allowing me to be confident enough to write my testimony and tell my story. I was born in 1982, 6 years before I was born my mom was part of the 1976 Chowchilla kidnapping. She was one of the students on the bus that was hijacked. This was a severely traumatic experience for her, and she is still trying to cope with it today. Due to this experience in her life, she was emotionally unavailable while I was growing up. I was raised in a home where there were drugs & alcohol. I blamed myself for all the chaos in our home & felt alone. At the age of 15, I had so many mixed emotions and this started my downward spiral to using Methamphetamine which caused me to start getting into trouble with the law. I ended up in jail in 2022, this is where I heard about Jesus through the Merced County Jail Ministry. I was released to a program and upon completion received my commercial license, and a full-time position with the Merced County Rescue Mission Respite Care Program. I am grateful for all God has done in my life; without him I would not be where I am at today.

The scripture that helped me is Jeremiah 29:11

"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to prosper you and not harm you, plans to give you hope and a future".
